

# MwC Provides a Safe Place During the Pandemic

# Staying Open, Keeping People Safe

"Some people don't have the opportunity to stay home right now," says Janet Karpus, Associate Director. "We're open because we are here to keep those people safe. To provide a space where they can wash their hands and keep their clothes clean. We're here to make sure they can take a shower and they have a mask to wear. A lot of other places are closed, but we're open for them."

In March, when the COVID-19 pandemic forced many businesses and organizations to close, MwC staff worked quickly to modify our services and enhance sanitation with the goal of keeping our doors open.

"We decided early on that we were going to serve as many people as we could for as long as possible," says Phil Behrens, Facilities Coordinator.

Phil was instrumental in adapting the building to increase safety for staff and members (those we serve). He installed Plexiglas barriers around the Service Desk and Welcome Desk, two high-traffic areas. He also worked with the Security Team to determine how many people could be inside the building to maintain a safe distance between one another. For the first few months, a maximum of 45 members were welcomed into the building at a time. Our capacity is now up to 66 members after opening more rooms.

To make sure that our facility stays clean and safe, our Custodial Team has worked even harder than usual. In addition to our already enhanced cleaning, we close daily from 11:00am – 12:00pm, and again at 4:30pm to allow for additional disinfecting.

Brian, Custodian, says that, "When this all first started, the extra tasks seemed like a lot, but now it's our normal routine and we all pitch in. We do everything we can to keep things clean. We sanitize constantly."

Since the pandemic began, we have worked without volunteers to keep the number of people in the building as low as possible.

"We really miss having the volunteers here. Our members miss them too," says Tony, Member Services Assistant. "Not having them here means more work for us, but it also means that I'm getting more chances to talk to our members, and they're still getting the resources they need."

Kelly notes that, "During busier times of the day, we're seeing members come in to do what they need to do and then leave so we can let someone else in. We're still busy, it's just a different flow."

# Meals To-Go

Before the pandemic, our dining room would fill up with members and volunteers for family-style breakfasts and lunches every day of the week. Due to the risk that would now pose, we have switched to boxed and bagged meals. Members that are in the building during meal times eat in the Commons Area to maintain distance from others. Meals for anyone not in the facility are provided to-go at the back door of the kitchen.

Michael Albanese, Kitchen Manager, admits that it's challenging, "Some things are hard to serve in a box or bag and we're trying not to use so many disposable items. It also costs more to purchase things like individual cartons of milk. Our goal is to have a healthy variety in our meals and use donor funds responsibly."

Even with the extra challenges, Michael says, "My staff is doing really well. They are so organized. With their hard work, we've been able to serve some hot breakfasts and four hot lunches each week."


